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General Agricultural Tour in Romania

A well balanced mixture of farm visits and current realities of Romania's agriculture, with the discovery of the country's natural beauties, the charm of old and well preserved architectural treasures and the real life in the traditional villages.

Highlights:

- Technical visits to selected representative farms and discussions with the local farmers
- General presentation about Romania's agriculture, highlighting the current realities
- The People's House in Bucharest and Dracula's castle in Bran village
- Sparkling wine tasting session
- Visits of some of the most beautiful cities in Romania, like Sibiu and Brasov and of Sighisoara mediaeval citadel, included in the UNESCO World Heritage list
- Ride in horse pulled carriages in Viscri village

Program

Day 1

Arrival at Bucharest on Henri Coanda airport and meet our guide. Transfer to the city centre, city tour and dinner at one of the best known restaurants in Bucharest.

Accommodation in a 4**** hotel in the city centre.



Day 2

In the morning a general presentation about Romanian agriculture, followed by a visit to the People's House, the 2nd biggest building in the world after the Pentagon. Lunch in Bucharest.

In the afternoon transfer towards the North and visit a big cereal farm, with about 2,500 ha of land. Visit the farm, meeting and discussions with the administrative members.

Then we continue towards Transylvania and reach Azuga mountain resort where we visit Rhein wine cellars, built in 1892, the ancient wine suppliers of the royal family of Romania. Meeting with the specialist of the cellar who will explain the whole process of sparkling wine making. Sparkling wine tasting and dinner at the cellars.

In the evening we reach Brasov – one of Transylvania's major cities. Also known as Kronstadt due to the presence of German colonists as early as the 12th century, Brasov has a medieval centre boasting colorful facades, old ramparts, secret narrow cobbled streets, guard towers and the largest gothic church between Vienna and Istanbul.

Accommodation in 3*** hotels – medieval buildings situated in the main square of the city.



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Day 3

In the morning we visit a dairy farm close to Brasov and meet the administrative members.

Then we continue to Bran village in order to visit Bran Castle (also known as Dracula`s Castle). It is a beautiful 14th century castle, restored in the 19th century to its former glory, by the royal family of Romania.

We visit the imposing structure guarding the passing point between the two Romanian provinces: Walachia to the south and Transylvania to the north. Traditional lunch in a restaurant.

In the afternoon return to Brasov. City tour – we walk the medieval centre, one of the best preserved in Romania, housing The Black Church, the City Council Square, the ramparts erected in medieval times by the Saxon colonists, and one of the narrowest streets in Europe, The Binder Street.

Dinner with symphonic program at the ancient citadel of Brasov.

Accommodation in 3*** hotels – medieval buildings situated in the main square of the city.



Day 4

In the morning we visit a buffalo farm and then a dairy farm.

At noon we reach Viscri village (Deutschweisskirch). This is a Saxon village included in the UNESCO heritage list, one of the villages in Romania where the Prince of Wales owns a traditional Romanian house.

We have lunch prepared by the locals and then we take a ride in horse pulled carriages around the village and we visit the fortified church.



In the evening we leave Viscri and head towards Sighisoara – a medieval citadel included in the UNESCO heritage list, inhabited continuously ever since its settlement by the German colonists.

Dinner and accommodation in a 3*** hotel in the centre of the citadel in a medieval building.

Day 5

In the morning we visit a hop farm and then we transfer to Biertan village, where we visit the fortified church and have lunch in a medieval restaurant.

Continue to Sibiu city, which in 2007 was the European capital of culture. Sibiu is packed full of fascinating sites to explore, from its ramparts and towers to its passageways linking the two parts of the town together. City tour.



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In the evening we have about 30 min by bus to Sibiel village, where we spend the night in guesthouses and where we have a traditional dinner accompanied by local brandy and wine.



Day 6

In the morning we visit a peasant workshop of icons painted on glass and also a traditional sheepfold – cheese tasting. Lunch and transfer to Bucharest.
